# Officer Response

Member's attention is drawn to Page 46 of your agenda where the officer report addresses this issue and concludes that the proposed development is unlikely to impede access to flood defence or management facilities or have an adverse impact on the watercourses, flood flows or storage capacity. It is material to note that Environment Agency standing advice relates to all householder extensions and that an extension of a very similar footprint could be undertaken at the property as 'permitted development'.
