# **Decision on the Application**

Members have listened to the application and the concerns raised by the residents. Members are aware that residents have had problems with noise from other licensed premises in the area. However the applicant has made clear how different they are to other licensed premises in the area. They are a unique premises for elite athletes and want to be able to cater for the unique needs of those sports people on a 24/7 basis.

Members were satisfied that measures are in place, in particular, that they have not applied for music outside, for the licensing objectives to be met. Therefore members have granted the application in full.

There is a right to appeal to the Magistrates Court within 21 days from the date on which the party is notified of the determination of the decision of the Sub-Committee Panel.
