Summary of Incidents and Enforcement Actions

Numbers of Incidents

1. Bradgate Park have dealt with a number of dog control incidents across the estate in the 3 years since the last Order was introduced.

The number has reduced due to people complying with the controls but there is still a number of incidents the Rangers have dealt with. Numbers are shown in the table below:

Year	Number of reports
2020 - 21	9
2021–22	14
2022 to now	5

- Enforcement of a dog control incident is usually by means of a fixed penalty notice (FPN). An authorised Officer must witness it for an offence to occur. FPNs can be served for failing to comply with the following conditions:
 - Allowing a dog to foul and not clearing away afterwards.
 - Failing to put a dog on a lead in the zone where dogs must be on leads at all times (yellow zone)
 - Failing to put a dog on a lead if directed to do so by an authorised officer
 - Allowing a dog to go into a dog exclusion zone (grey zone)

Bradgate Park Estate have an enforcement policy where they will ask the individual to comply, and they will only get an FPN if they refuse or fail at a later date to comply with the conditions in the Order.

The number of FPNs issued since the last Order is shown in the table below:
