Polling Districts, Polling Places and Polling Stations Review 2022 – Returning Officer’s Final Proposals (November 2022)

Introduction:

This report considers each polling district, polling place and polling station under the current arrangements and the Returning Officer (RO) has, where applicable, considered known issues during the preparation of this document.

All of the polling stations currently used have been visited by a Council Officer for risk assessment purposes and these comments have also been taken into consideration.

The RO is proposing to keep the existing polling arrangements where they remain suitable and to make changes only where circumstances require. The intention is not to make changes unless they are needed and justified.

Background:

The Local Government Boundary Commission for England (LGBCE) has undertaken a review of the electoral wards of Charnwood and made the following recommendations:

- Charnwood will be represented by 52 councillors, the same number as there are under the current arrangements.
- Charnwood will have 24 wards, 4 fewer than there are under the current arrangements.
- The boundaries of 26 of the existing wards will change, except for the boundaries of Anstey and Quorn & Mountsorrel which will stay the same.

The new arrangements will come into force for the local government elections on Thursday 4th May 2023 following The Charnwood (Electoral Changes) Order 2022. As a result of the changes, the council is required to carry out an interim review of all the polling districts and polling places in the Borough. The wards must be sub-divided into smaller geographical areas called polling districts. Each polling district has a polling place where the polling station for the district is located and where electors living in the district will vote. It should also be noted that this review is only concerned with the internal polling district boundaries. The ward boundaries have been ratified by Parliament and cannot be changed.

Schedule 2 in the Local Democracy, Economic Development and Construction Act 2009 (the 2009 Act) provides that if a Parish is to be divided between different wards, it must also be divided into Parish wards so that each Parish lies wholly within a single ward. Under the 2009 Act, the LGBCE have the power to make changes to Parish electoral arrangements where these are as a direct

consequence of their recommendations for principal authority warding arrangements. The LGBCE has made the following recommendations for Parish ward arrangements:

- Shepshed Town Council will comprise of 15 councillors, as at present, representing two wards.
- Thurmaston Parish Council will comprise of 19 councillors, as at present, representing five wards.

Guidelines:

The following considerations have been taken into account when drawing up these proposals. The first two considerations are required by electoral law; the other considerations are guidelines and not strict rules.

- The Council must seek to ensure that all electors have such reasonable facilities for voting as are practicable in the circumstances.
- The Council must seek to ensure that so far as is reasonable and practicable every polling place is accessible to electors who are disabled.
- Ideally, the polling place should be in its own polling district. A polling place is the building or area in which a polling station will be selected by the RO. Polling places should be within the polling district unless special circumstances make it desirable to designate an area outside the district, such as circumstances where there are no suitable venues in the polling district.
- Ideally, there should be no more than 2,500 electors voting in person at the polling station which falls in line with the recommendations of the Electoral Commission (EC).
- Preferably, no polling place should be shared by two wards.
- Polling places should be “logical”; that is, electors should not have to pass another polling place to get to their own place.
- Schools should only be used where there is no other suitable permanent building available due to the potential disruption which can be caused to pupils.

- Portakabins (Mobile Units) should only be used where there is no other reasonable option, as these are costly to operate.

The Tables:

This report deals with each Borough ward separately, split between the Parliamentary Constituencies of Charnwood and Loughborough, and the tables show:

- The proposed polling district.
- The proposed polling place.
- The proposed polling station building(s).
- The number of electors as of 3rd October 2022 (the most recent monthly update).
- Indication of whether or not there are access concerns and what those concerns are. It should be noted that although the polling stations show a comment of “no”, this does not necessarily mean that access is ideal, but that any shortcomings can be dealt with by the provision of equipment such as ramps and by the polling station staff at the time of an election.
- Indication of whether or not there are electorate size concerns where the number of voters in person exceeds 2,500.
- Indication of whether or not there are other concerns, such as poor heating/lighting. It should be noted that although the polling stations show a comment of “no”, this does not necessarily mean that there are no concerns, but that any shortcomings can be dealt with by the provision of equipment and by the polling station staff at the time of an election.
- Any comments or proposals being made by the RO.

Returning Officer’s Final Proposals:

The LGBCE has not made any changes to the ward boundaries for Anstey. As initially proposed, the single polling district for Anstey (Polling District CA) should be split into two separate polling districts as there are currently significantly more than 2,500 electors voting in person at the polling station which does not comply with EC recommendations.

Polling District CA1: The RO proposes that the Jubilee Hall is a suitable polling place and polling station for electors in Polling District CA1 as feedback indicates that there are no known problems at this polling station.

Polling District CA2: The RO proposes that Woolden Hill Primary School is a suitable polling place and polling station for electors in Polling District CA2. An inspection of Woolden Hill Primary School was carried out to assess its suitability as a polling station and it was concluded that Woolden Hill Primary School has adequate facilities for polling, including disabled parking and disabled access. The RO acknowledges that a consultation response was received which did not support the use of schools as a polling station due to school closure. However, Woolden Hill Primary School will not have to close on polling day in order to provide polling facilities for electors. Instead, Woolden Hill Primary School intends to use the experience of operating as a polling station to support their curriculum in educating the children on democracy.

Returning Officer’s Final Proposals:

Polling District CC: No amendments to the current arrangements are proposed.

Polling District CD: It was originally proposed that the RO should identify a permanent building to provide voting facilities for electors in Polling District CD. However, the RO has been unable to identify a suitable permanent building within, or close to, the polling district area. For the election held in May 2021, a Mobile Unit in the Car Park of Highcliffe C. P. School was used to facilitate voting for electors. Feedback indicates that there are no known problems at this polling station. Therefore, the RO proposes to designate a Mobile Unit in the Car Park of Highcliffe C. P. School as a polling place and polling station for electors in Polling District CD. The RO acknowledges that a consultation response was received which did not support the use of

schools as a polling station due to school closure, however siting a Mobile Unit on the school premises will avoid the need to close the school.

Polling District CE: For the last election held in May 2021, Hallam Fields Hall was used as a polling place and polling station to provide voting facilities for electors in the polling district area. Hallam Fields Hall was considered to be a better venue as it avoided disruption to the school that neighbours The Pavilion. Feedback indicates that there are no known problems at this polling station. Therefore, the RO proposes Hallam Fields Hall as a polling place and polling station to facilitate voting for electors in Polling District CE.

Returning Officer’s Final Proposals:

The RO proposes to alter the internal polling district boundaries within the Borough ward of Mountsorrel to ensure that there are a more equal number of electors in Polling District CL1 and Polling District CL2 in order to comply with EC recommendations.

Polling District CL1: No amendments to current polling place and polling station arrangements are proposed.

Polling District CL2: The RO proposes that the Mountsorrel Memorial Centre is a suitable venue to replace the Mountsorrel Methodist Church to provide polling facilities for electors in Polling District CL2. The Mountsorrel Memorial Centre can accommodate more than one polling station. For the election in May 2021, Mountsorrel Memorial Centre successfully accommodated electors in both Polling District CL1 and Polling District CL2 when the Mountsorrel Methodist Church was unavailable. Feedback also indicates that there are no known problems at this polling station.

Polling District CL3: As a result of the LGBCE’s recommendations, Polling District CL3 will be included in the Borough ward of Mountsorrel. This change has no effect on the Parish ward and County Division boundaries. There is no impact on the current polling place and polling station which will continue to be used.

Polling District CB4: As initially proposed, the RO has reviewed the current polling place arrangements for Polling District CB4. The RO proposes that the Jubilee Room in Barkby is no longer a suitable polling place to facilitate voting for electors in Hamilton Lea. The RO has been able to obtain permission from the landowner in Hamilton Lea. As a result, the RO proposes to site a Mobile Unit at the end of Goldsborough Close in Hamilton Lea as a polling place and polling station to facilitate voting for electors in Polling District CB4.

Polling District DE2: As a result of the LGBCE’s final recommendations, Polling District DE will be split between two separate Borough ward boundaries. This change has no effect on County Division boundaries. This change has resulted in the creation of a new polling district and Parish ward in the Borough Ward of South Charnwood. The RO proposes to designate the Jubilee Room in Barkby as a polling place and polling station for electors in Polling District DE2 as there is currently no obvious building within or close to the Thorpebury development. The RO proposes that this decision should be kept under review whilst the Thorpebury development progresses.

Returning Officer’s Final Proposals:

As initially proposed, the single polling district for Rothley (Polling District CQ) should be split into two separate polling districts as there are currently significantly more than 2,500 electors voting in person at the polling station which does not comply with EC recommendations.

Polling District CQ1: The RO proposes that Rothley Village Hall is a suitable polling place and polling station to facilitate voting for electors in Polling District CQ1. Rothley Village Hall was used to facilitate voting for the election in May 2021 when the Rothley Centre was unavailable, and feedback indicates that there are no known problems at this polling station.

Polling District CQ2: The RO proposes that the Rothley Centre is a suitable polling place and polling station to facilitate voting for electors in Polling District CQ2. The Rothley Centre has previously been used as a polling station and feedback indicates that there are no known problems at this polling station.

Polling District CT: No amendments to the current arrangements are proposed.

Polling District DA: No amendments to the current arrangements are proposed.

Polling District DB: No amendments to the current arrangements are proposed.

Polling District DH2: As a result of the LGBCE’s final recommendations, Polling District DH will be split between two separate Borough ward boundaries. This change has no effect on the Parish ward and County Division boundaries. This change has resulted in the creation of a new polling district in the Borough Ward of Rothley Brook. There is no impact on the current polling place and polling station which will continue to be used for Polling District DH1 and Polling District DH2.

Returning Officer’s Final Proposals:

Polling District CU: For the election held in May 2021, Syston Baptist Church was not available which led to the RO having to site a Mobile Unit at the Car Park of Midland Railway Hotel to provide voting facilities for this polling district area. Feedback indicates that there are no known problems at this polling station. The RO has been unable to identify an alternative permanent building to replace Syston Baptist Church. Therefore, the RO proposes to site a Mobile Unit at the Car Park of Midland Railway Hotel as a suitable polling place and polling station for electors in Polling District CU.

Polling Districts, Polling Places and Polling Stations Review 2022 – Returning Officer’s Final Proposals (November 2022)

Polling District CW: As a result of the LGBCE’s recommendations, the Scout Hall, Oxford Street, Syston, is not included in the new Borough ward of Syston. Therefore, the RO proposes to allocate the electors in Polling District CW to the Mobile Unit sited at the Car Park of Midland Railway Hotel. The RO recognises that the total number of electors voting in person at the Mobile Unit will exceed the EC’s recommendations. However, the RO proposes that any concern regarding the size of the electorate will be dealt with by the provision of additional staff and equipment at the polling station.

Returning Officer’s Final Proposals:

Polling District DC: No amendments to the current arrangements are proposed.

Polling District DD: The RO acknowledges that a consultation response was received which did not support the use of schools as a polling station due to school closure. As a result, the RO proposes to site a Mobile Unit in the Car Park of Thurmaston Community Centre as a polling place and polling station for electors in Polling District DD to avoid school closure of Church Hill Infant School. The RO sited a Mobile Unit in the Car Park of Thurmaston Community Centre for the election in May 2021 and feedback indicates that there are no known problems at this polling station.

Polling District DE1: As a result of the LGBCE’s final recommendations, Polling District DE will be split between two separate Borough wards boundaries. This change has no effect on the County Division boundaries. This change has resulted in the creation of a new polling district in the Borough Ward of Thurmaston.
