PERFORMANCE MONITORING - QUESTIONS (minute 2023/24 14).

from the Head of Regulatory Services and Community Safety regarding the location of Air Quality Management Areas, whether the air quality had improved in Loughborough Town Centre since pedestrianisation, and decreased in Shepshed since the opening of the incinerator


Officer/Cabinet Lead Member (Blackshaw) response:

Our air quality data is available in our LAQM Annual Status Report (ASR) for 2023 on our website at http://www.charnwood.gov.uk/pages/airpollution This report summarises our monitoring for 2022.

The National Air Quality Objective for Nitrogen Dioxide (NO_2) is an annual mean of 40 μ g/m³. The report confirms that NO_2 concentrations (the main pollutant associated with motor vehicles) were compliant with the national NO_2 Air Quality Objectives for all monitoring locations across Charnwood.


Specifically for Loughborough, the Graph below show the trend in annual mean NO₂ concentrations measured in the town centre following the opening of the inner relief road in November 2014.

As can be seen, NO₂ levels have decreased significantly being above the annual mean objective before the inner relief road opened and compliant with the annual mean objective since 2014.

Trends in annual mean NO₂ concentrations for Shepshed are shown in the graph below and also show a decrease.



Plot of NO₂ Concentration against Year for Shepshed sites

Additional monitoring is now being undertaken around the incinerator using a continuous sensor to monitor PM_{10} and $PM_{2.5}$ concentrations. This unit has been located to the east of Shepshed / M1 J23 towards Loughborough. There is not yet enough data to plot any long-term trends since the incinerator opened. We therefore have no evidence to suggest that air quality has decreased.

The mean concentrations for particulate matter (PM_{10} and $PM_{2.5}$) obtained so far, can be summarised as follows:

from the Director of Housing and Wellbeing as to why two garage sites / parking areas were not in the Garage Site Review.

Officer/Cabinet Lead Member (Hamilton) response:

The draft document considered sites with the potential for building 4 or more properties on them. The sites at Church Lane (5 garages) and Martin Court (2 garages) were therefore noted in the summary of sites, however due to their relatively small size a more detailed appraisal was not undertaken. It is likely the garages at Martin Court will fall substantively under the review of sheltered accommodation, rather than the review of garage sites.
