Under the previous management, a lot of outdoor music performance was made, especially at weekends and periods of fine weather.

Living above the premises (The Boat house) in The Rookery, weekend and evening sitting outside in our garden was spoilt by the noise coming from the premises. The problem was always the over-amplified bass rhythm. This low frequency noise travels greater distances than the higher frequency "music" sounds and was quite disturbing to us. The solution: Go indoors and close all the windows. Not very comfortable in hot weather.

I hope that in considering the licensing — and the very late hours for which it is requested, the licensing personnel specify some limit for the noise level issuing from the premises and hope that the requested hours be considerably reduced to 10.30 p.m. (from midnight and 1.00 a.m.) and that outdoor music playing of music be banned.

Is there some way of restricting the volume of music played indoors? — so that music issuing from a room, through open windows for example, does not disturb the local environment.
