In the past the Hotel has held weddings and parties throughout the summer months, presumably indoors and within licenced hours, which have caused huge annoyance but been tolerated as they were not regular and usually on a Saturday afternoon and evening. There have occasionally been fireworks after dark. It is not unknown for helicopters to land in the grounds.

The hotel is close to a large number of houses on Unitt Road, Northage Close, Wood Lane, The Coppice and Selvester Close all of which house a standard cross section of families and elderly people.

On Sunday morning this week (14th June) I had to negotiate two piles of vomit on the pavement on Wood Lane, and whilst this is not a regular occurrence (and, indeed, may not have been generated by the hotel) it is very unpleasant and can only be exacerbated by the addition of an outdoor concert arena where drinking will doubtlessly be encouraged.

I have visited outdoor concerts and plays at Kilworth House and the traffic generated by these events is significant. The road onto which the Hotel traffic discharges is not suitable for a concentrated influx of a large number of vehicles; visibility is poor, even in daylight due to the large number of trees, and the sharp bends under the trees are on a downhill slope into the village where speeds are often excessive. There have been a number of crashes at the corners resulting in the wall across the road having to be rebuilt. I cross Wood Lane to visit my elderly parents twice a day and EVERY day at least one vehicle travels on the wrong side of the road past the entry to Northage Close. I presume this is caused by the long visibility splay for Northage Close which people seem to think is an extra lane.

One Thursday evening in September 2015 the hotel held an event which included an outdoor performance with music and went on until the early hours. At about 10.30 when my husband and I went to bed the noise was so loud we could not sleep even with the windows closed and my husband tried to ring the hotel to complain but could not get an answer. Eventually he got dressed and went across to speak to them about it. The person on the desk denied any connection with the proceedings and said that the manager was not available to discuss it. My husband came home and rang the police who could hear the noise over the phone (with our windows closed) but apparently they have no jurisdiction over noise complaints and told us to contact Environmental Health. By now it was nearly midnight and there was obviously no answer on the number for Environmental Health.

The following day I was telephoned by E.H. and was told they had had 6 complaints about the noise and they would be visiting the hotel to follow up. I believe they sent an email explaining the outcome of the meeting but I am unable to locate it now as I have changed computers at least twice since it happened and the correspondence has been lost.

The manager rang me soon after the meeting with E.H. and invited us over for a drink to discuss it but I did not think it appropriate to go.
